To many people on the range	Stand behind waiting line	Participants	low	
Tripping over on range	Tell people to walk not run	Participants	Low	
Ripping out of long hair	Tie it back	Participants	Low	
Ripping out of earrings	Take out	Participants	Low	
String hitting arm	Put on arm guards	Participants	Low	
Hitting people on footpath	Keep eye on footpath (shout fast)	Members of the public	Low	
Third party injury	Bows and arrows locked away when not in use	Members of the public	Low	
People near bus	Ask them to move - shooters told only to shoot down the range	Campers	Low	
People in woods	Ask them to move - shooters told only to shoot down the range	Campers	Low	
Arrows going over net	Shooters told to shoot at targets	Horses	Low	

A safety briefing is held for all those taking part at the start of each session, a responsible leader is asked to keep control of the group whilst at the waiting line. Once on the range the Field Marshall (person in charge of the archery session) takes responsibility for the Safety of both staff and young people.
